

Local rules for this competition

1. This competition is held under the general rules of WPBSA and BSAACT competition rules. Where there is any inconsistency between the WPBSA, BSAACT, or these local rules, the local rules are to be used.
2. Start time is 7pm on Monday or Tuesday as per the draw, or by mutual agreement of both teams.
3. Format is best of four games, each game is best of three frames. One point is scored per frame won.
4. This is a handicap competition. Starting handicaps are half the handicap at the conclusion of the 2021 Autumn Snooker competition where available.
5. For each win/loss, the handicap goes down/up by two points. Handicaps do not change during a match.
6. Minimum number of players to avoid a forfeit is two.
7. The Home team captain puts down two names on the scorecard. The Away team captain puts down all four names on the scorecard. The home team captain then completes the card.
8. All players are to be recorded on the score card before the commencement of play.
9. If three or more snookers are required and only colours remain, the frame ends at the conclusion of the current break. For the avoidance of doubt, this means that the frame ends if the difference in scores is at least:
 - a. Yellow ball on: 36 points
 - b. Green ball on: 34 points
 - c. Brown ball on: 31 points
 - d. Blue ball on: 29 points
 - e. Pink ball on: 26 points
10. Players are reminded of the following WPBSA 6 Red rule (Rule 3:19(d)):

After potting a Red, or a free ball nominated as a Red, the striker must not leave their opponent snookered behind the nominated colour.
11. The following advice is given on the foul and a miss rule. The player must to the best of their ability endeavour to hit a ball on:
 - a. For all players, if full ball contact is available then foul and a miss would normally be called.
 - b. For all players, if the shot was not played with sufficient strength to reach a ball on, then foul and miss must be called.
 - c. For B grade players, if at least quarter ball contact is available then a foul and a miss should be called.
 - d. For A grade players, if a one-cushion escape is available from a snooker, then a foul and a miss should be called.
 - e. Except for in situations i- and ii- , B, C, and D grade players cannot be asked to replay the shot.
 - f. When a foul and a miss is called on an A grade player, they may be asked to replay the shot regardless of the grading of the opponent.
 - g. For the purposes of this rule, an A grade player has a handicap of 6 or less, and a B grade player has a handicap of 7 to 12.
